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First Six Actions

- Do not approach. Do not touch. Do not signal.
 - Corroborate the observation with a second source.
 - Establish standoff perimeter; clear the exclusion radius.
- Assume Tier T1 and Class V until classified.
 - Start a timestamped log — every action, every decision.
 - Notify up the escalation ladder; name an incident lead.

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Entity Classification System

CLASS	NAME	DEFINITION	LEAD POSTURE
Class I	Biological	Living organism, emergent or off-world origin	Medical / biosafety lead
Class II	Synthetic	Autonomous, robotic, or computational entity	Systems / cyber isolation lead
Class III	Hybrid	Simultaneously biological and engineered	Both doctrines in parallel
Class IV	Craft	Vessel, transport, or structure	Hazard site + possible occupants
Class V	Unresolved	Cannot yet be classified	Max containment until resolved

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Containment Tiers

TIER	POSTURE	CONDITIONS
T1	Observation	No contact. Remote sensing, standoff perimeter held.
T2	Barrier Contact	Sealed barrier, full PPE, closed atmosphere, decon on exit.
T3	Controlled Proximity	Supervised interaction in facility, medical officer present.
T4	Conditional Release	Escorted movement after documented clearance criteria.

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Six-Phase Response Sequence

#	STEP	ACTION
01	Detect	Corroborate via 2+ sensors or observers before acting
02	Secure	Standoff perimeter, most restrictive tier by default
03	Classify	Assign class — fixes lead agency, tier, assessments
04	Communicate	Fixed signaling sequence only, logged verbatim
05	Disposition	Custody/transfer/release under named signature
06	Record	Produce packets + after-action revision note

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Escalation Ladder

- 1. Local responder — report, isolate, do not approach
- 2. State / regional emergency management — perimeter
- 3. Federal lead agency assigned by entity class
- 4. Public health and medical command activation
- 5. Defense and airspace coordination as required
- 6. National command authority for disposition

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Communication Rules

- Non-hostile posture established before any signal
- Fixed sequence — no improvised contact attempts
- Every attempt and response logged verbatim, timestamped
- Interpretation separated from decision authority
- Consent and intent documented, never assumed
- One designated contact officer speaks for the response

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Required Documentation Packets

- Arrival Event Report (AER)
 - Entity Classification Record (ECR)
 - Medical & Integrity Assessment
- Environmental Compatibility Profile
 - Radiation & Exposure Log
 - Communication Attempt Transcript
- Hazard & Containment Determination
 - Disposition Order (signed)
 - After-Action Report & revision note
